Notice of Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) Proposed Central Queensland Coal Project

An EIS has been prepared on behalf of Central Queensland Coal Limited and Fairway Coal Limited (joint proponents) for the proposed Central Queensland Coal Project (the Project). The Project would be located in Central Queensland, approximately 130 kilometres (km) northwest of Rockhampton and approximately 25km northwest of Marlborough within the Livingstone Shire Council area. The Project covers approximately 3028 hectares, including mining lease application's 80187 and 700022.

The project would involve the development of three open-cut mine pits mining a 200 million tonne coal resource to produce initially 2 million tonnes per annum (Mtpa) of product coal and would rise to 10 Mtpa. The mine area would also comprise of two waste rock dumps, mine water dams, two mine industrial areas, two Coal Handling Preparation Plants, haul roads and a conveyor. The expected mine life is approximately 20 years including construction, operation, decommissioning and rehabilitation. Coal product would be transported via a haul road to a new train loadout facility that will connect to the existing North Coast Rail Line. Product coal would then be transported 175km north to the Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal.

Environmental Protection Act 1994 (Queensland)

On 16 December 2016 an application was made by Fairway Coal Limited under section 70 and 71 of the Environmental Protection Act 1994 (EP Act) to voluntarily prepare an EIS for the Project. On 27 January 2017 the Department of Environment and Heritage Protection (EHP) approved the application under section 72 of the EP Act.

Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (Commonwealth)

On 3 February 2017 the Project was determined to be a controlled action (EPBC 2016/7851) under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act). The controlling provisions are:

- World Heritage properties (sections 12 and 15A)
- National Heritage places (sections 15B and 15C)
- Listed threatened species and communities (sections 18 and 18A)
- Listed migratory species (sections 20 and 20A)
- Great Barrier Reef Marine Park (sections 24B and 24C)
- A water resource, in relation to coal seam gas development and large coal mining development (sections 24D and 24E)

The EIS process will assess potential impacts of the Project on the controlling provisions consistent with the bilateral agreement (section 45 of the EPBC Act) between the Commonwealth and Queensland governments for the purposes of the Commonwealth Government's assessment under part 8 of the EPBC Act.
